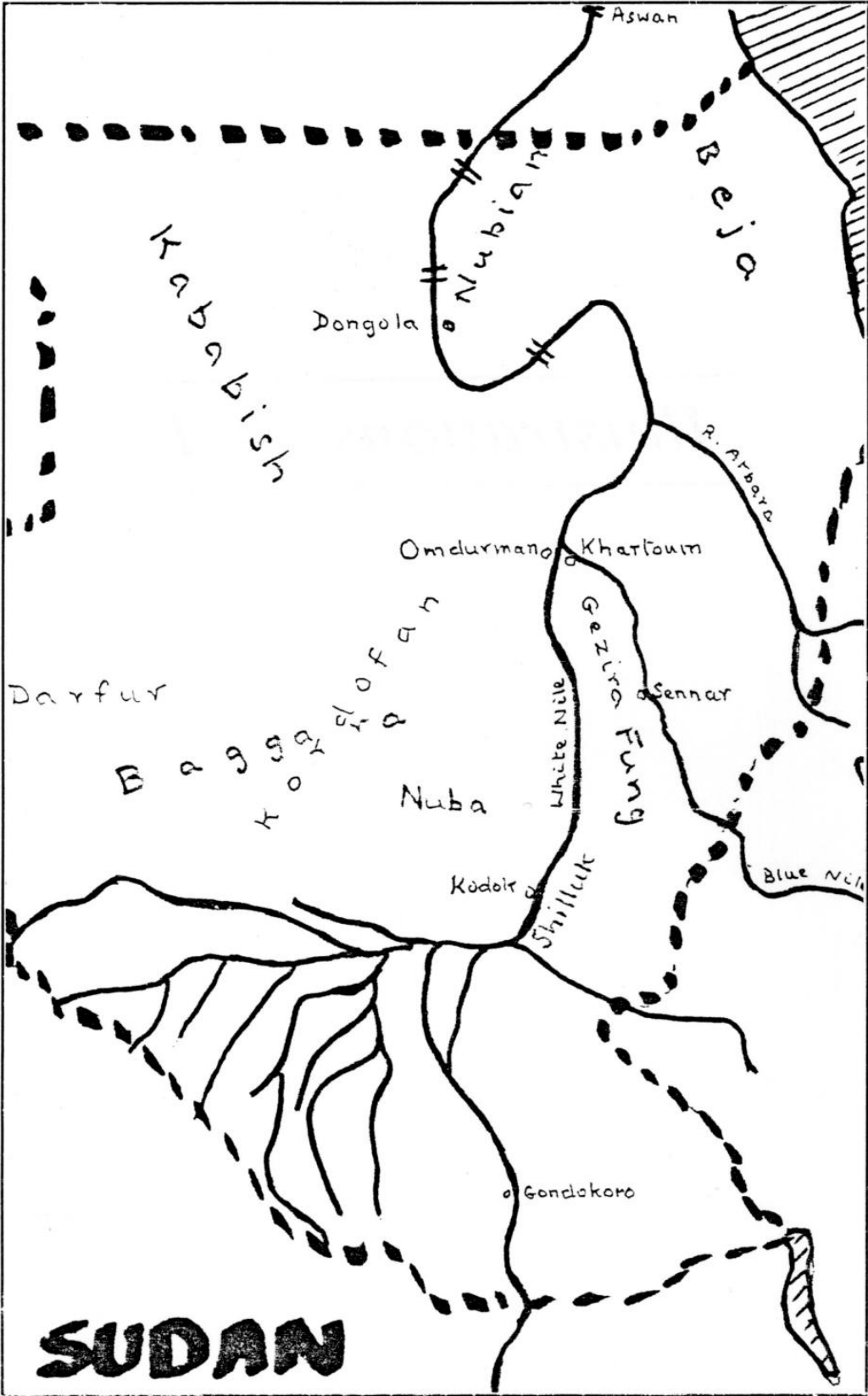
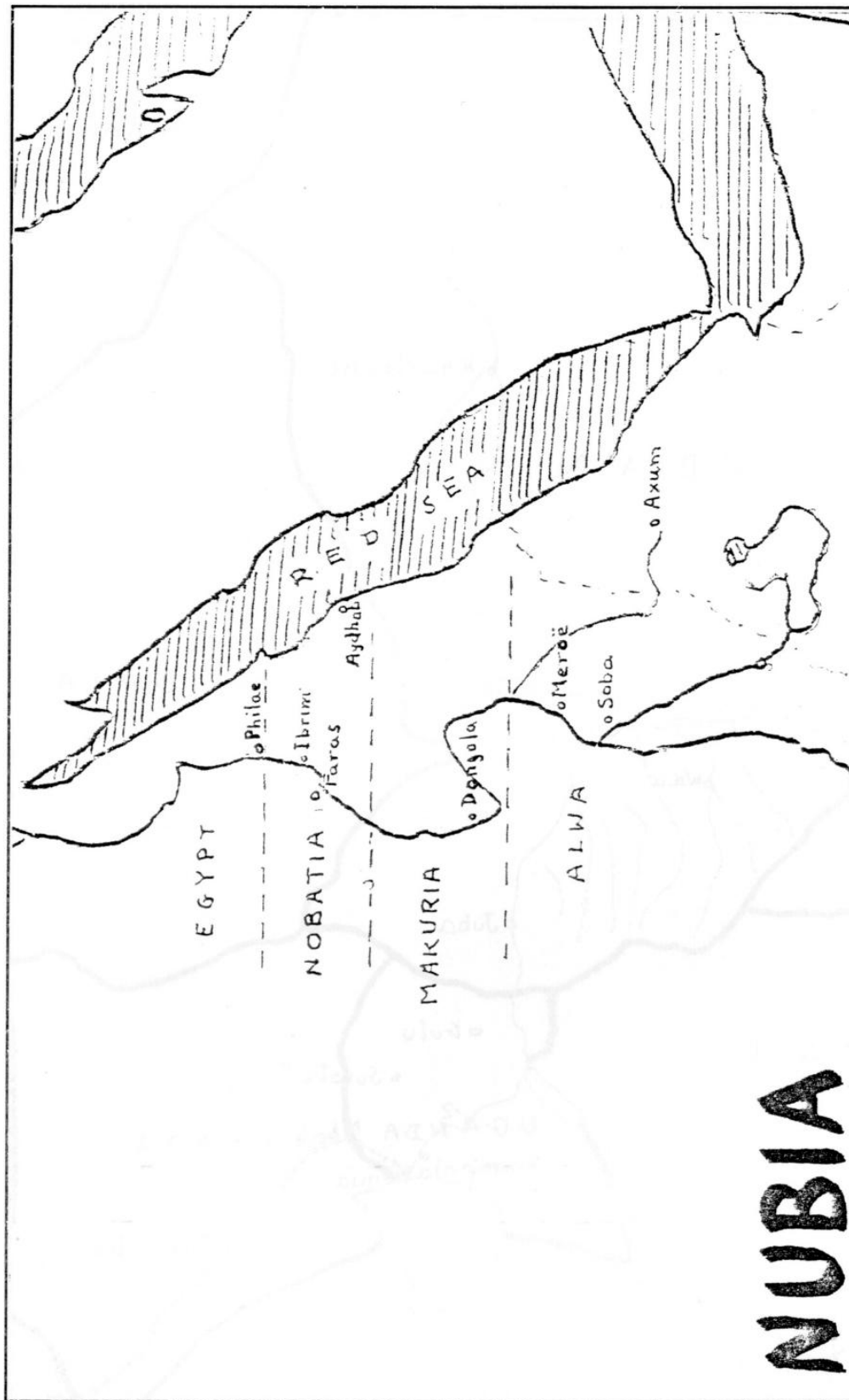

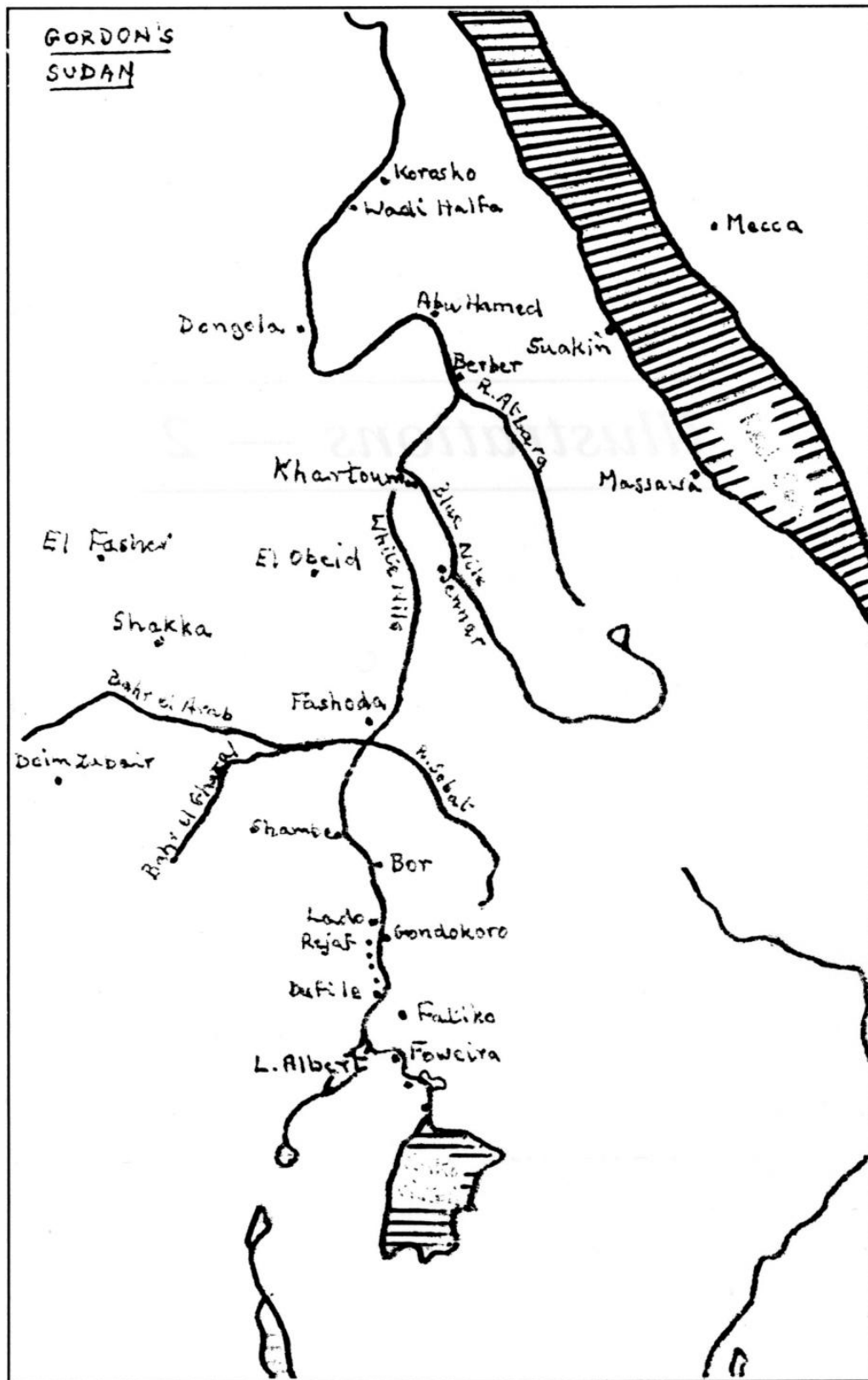

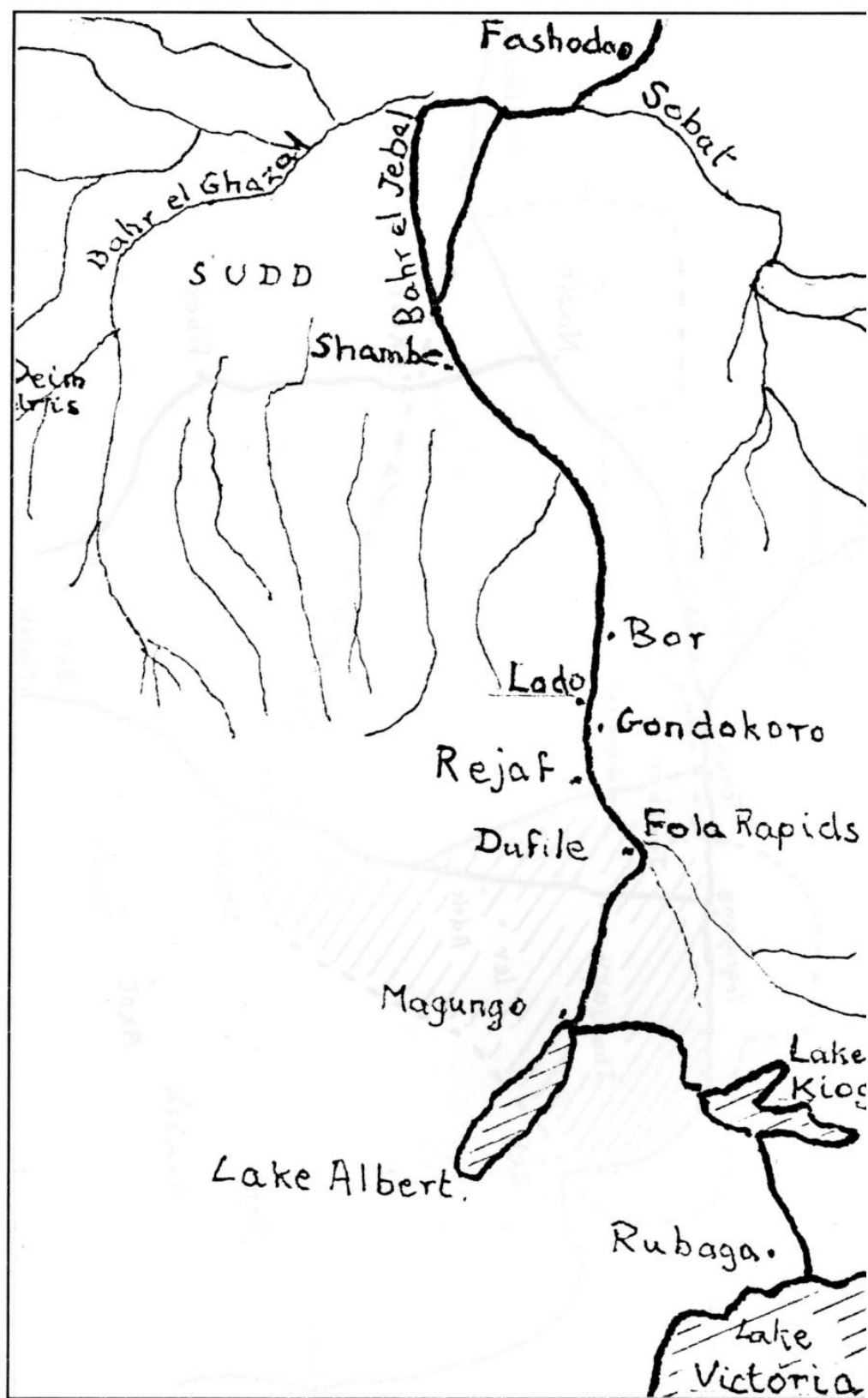

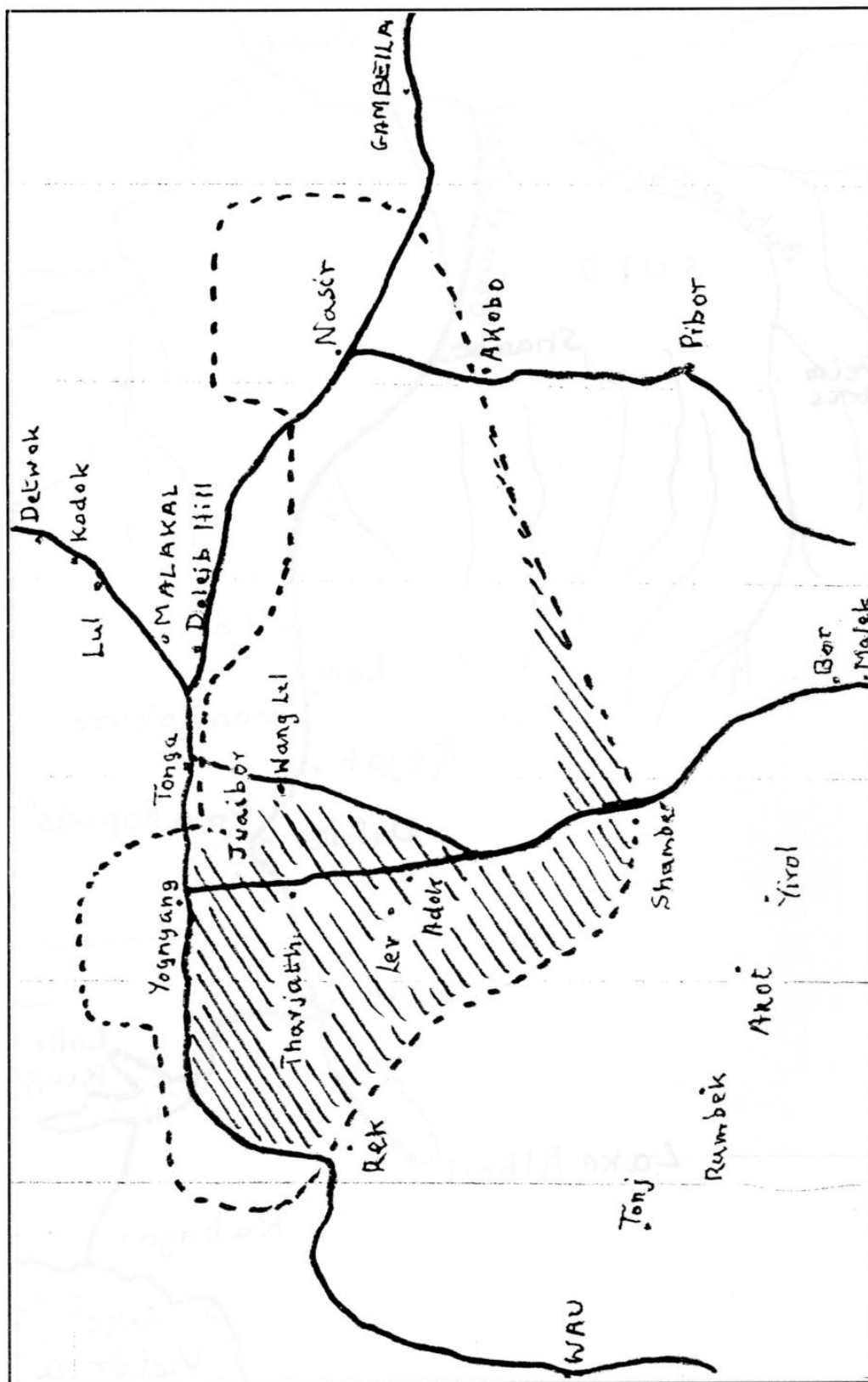


GORDON'S SUDAN

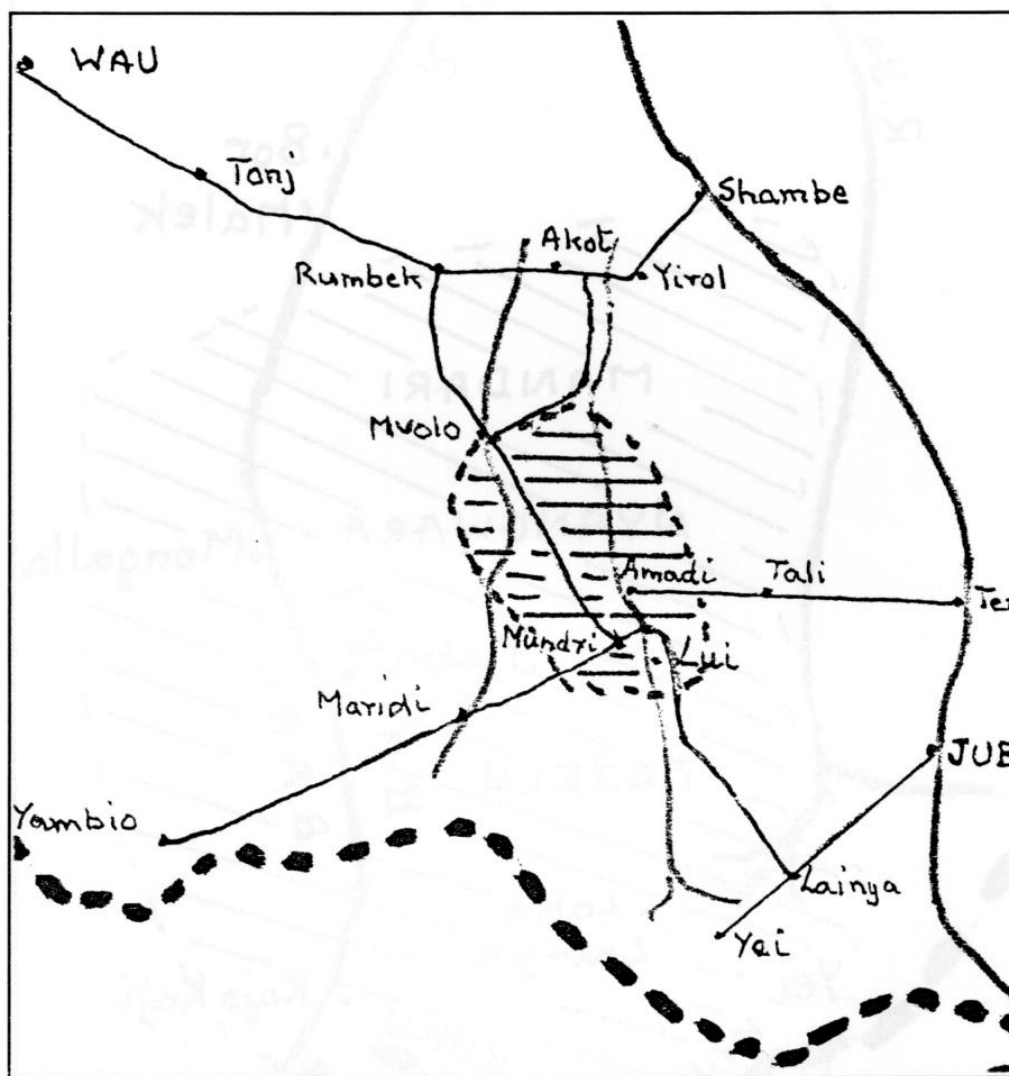

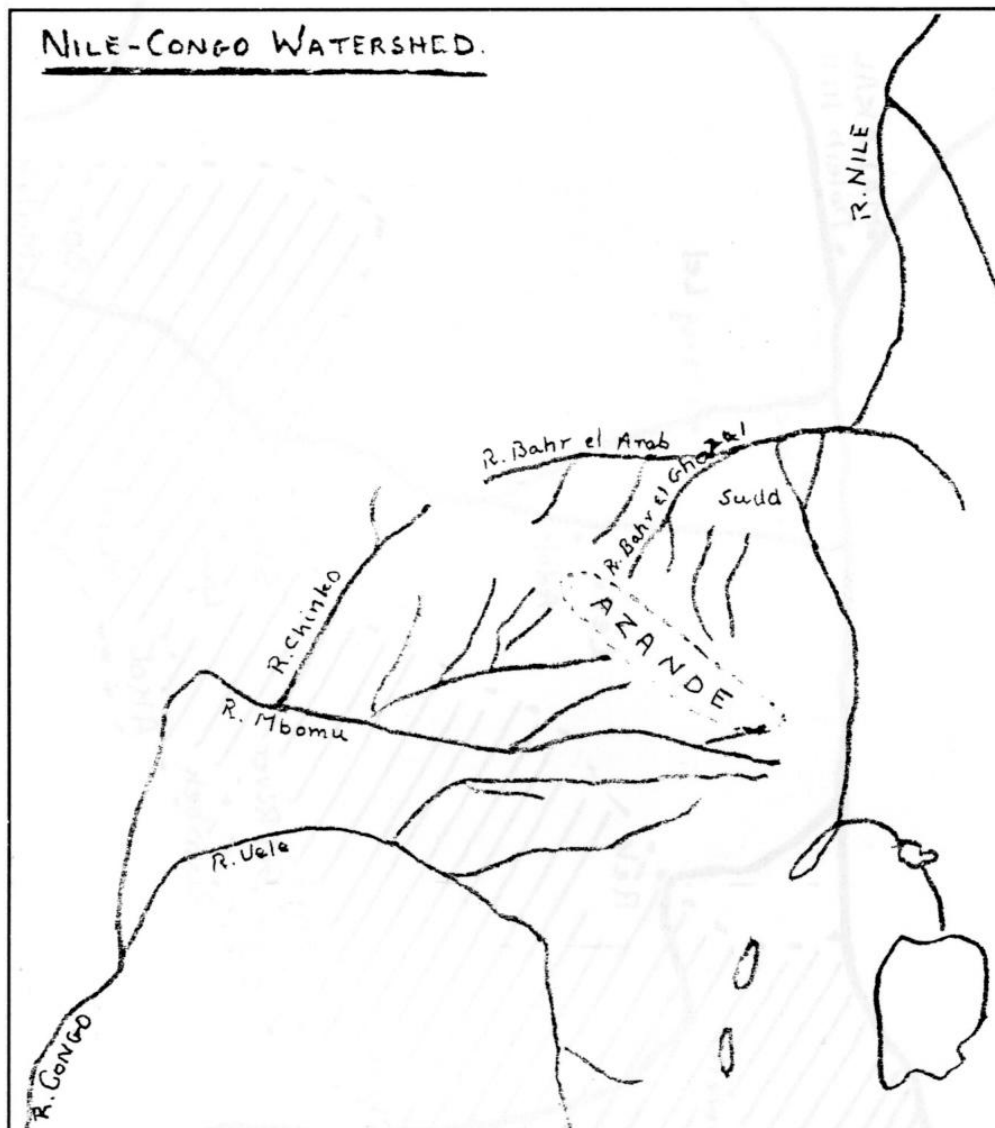
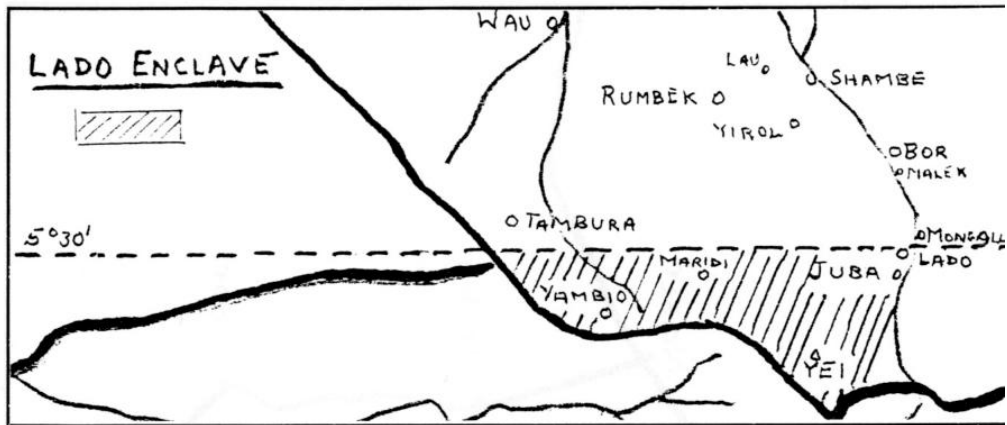

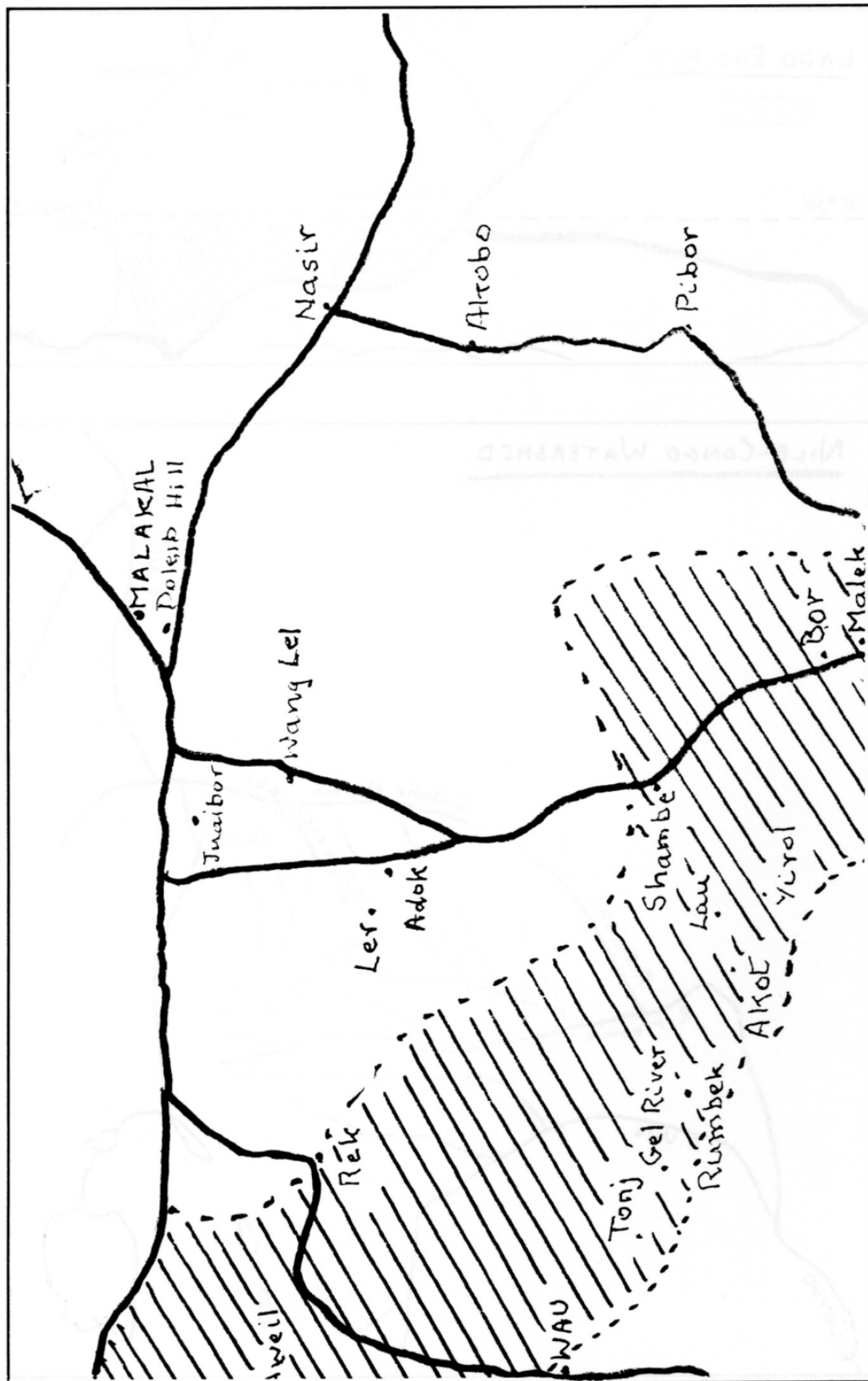


MORU COUNTRY

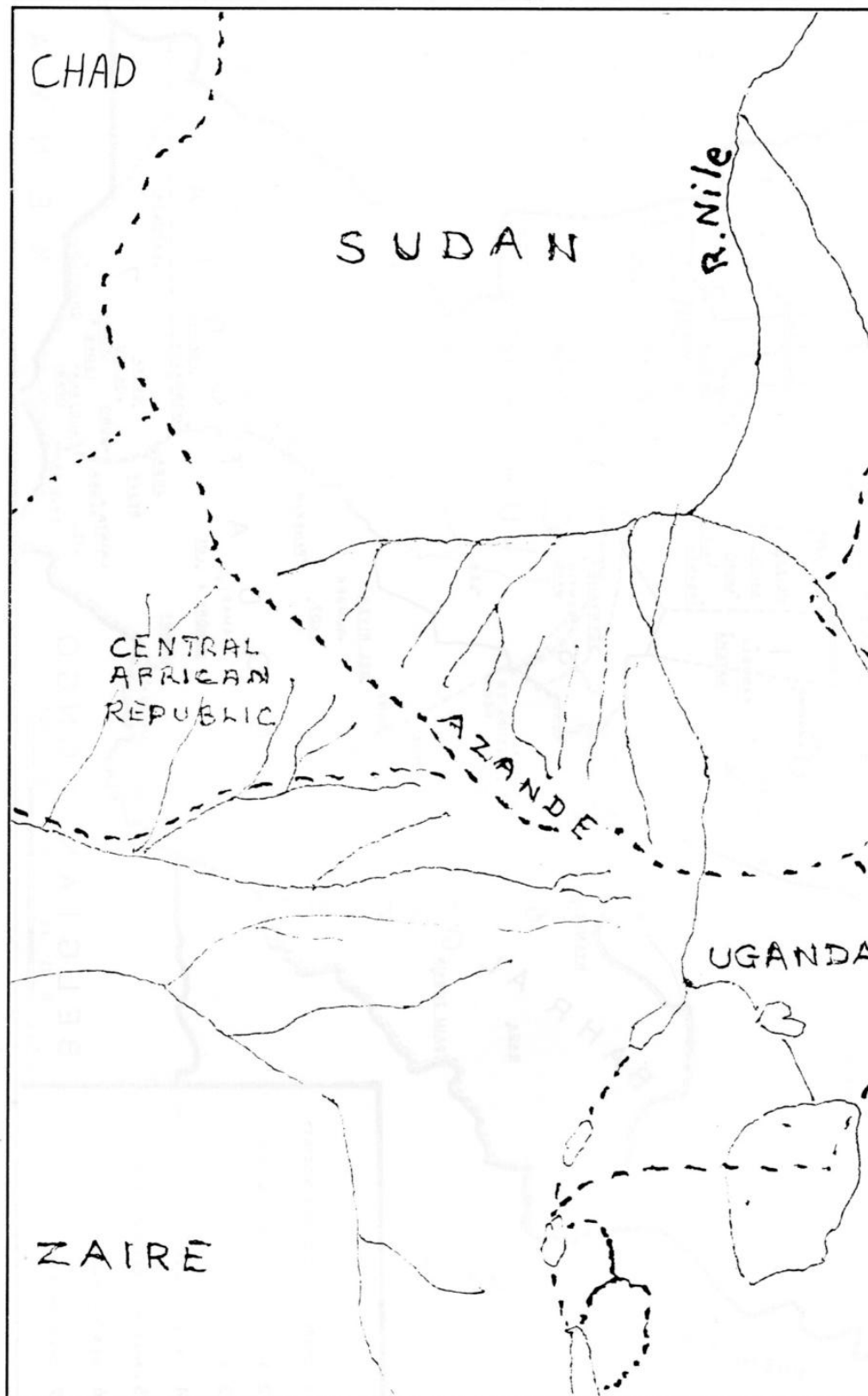


AZANDE COUNTRY

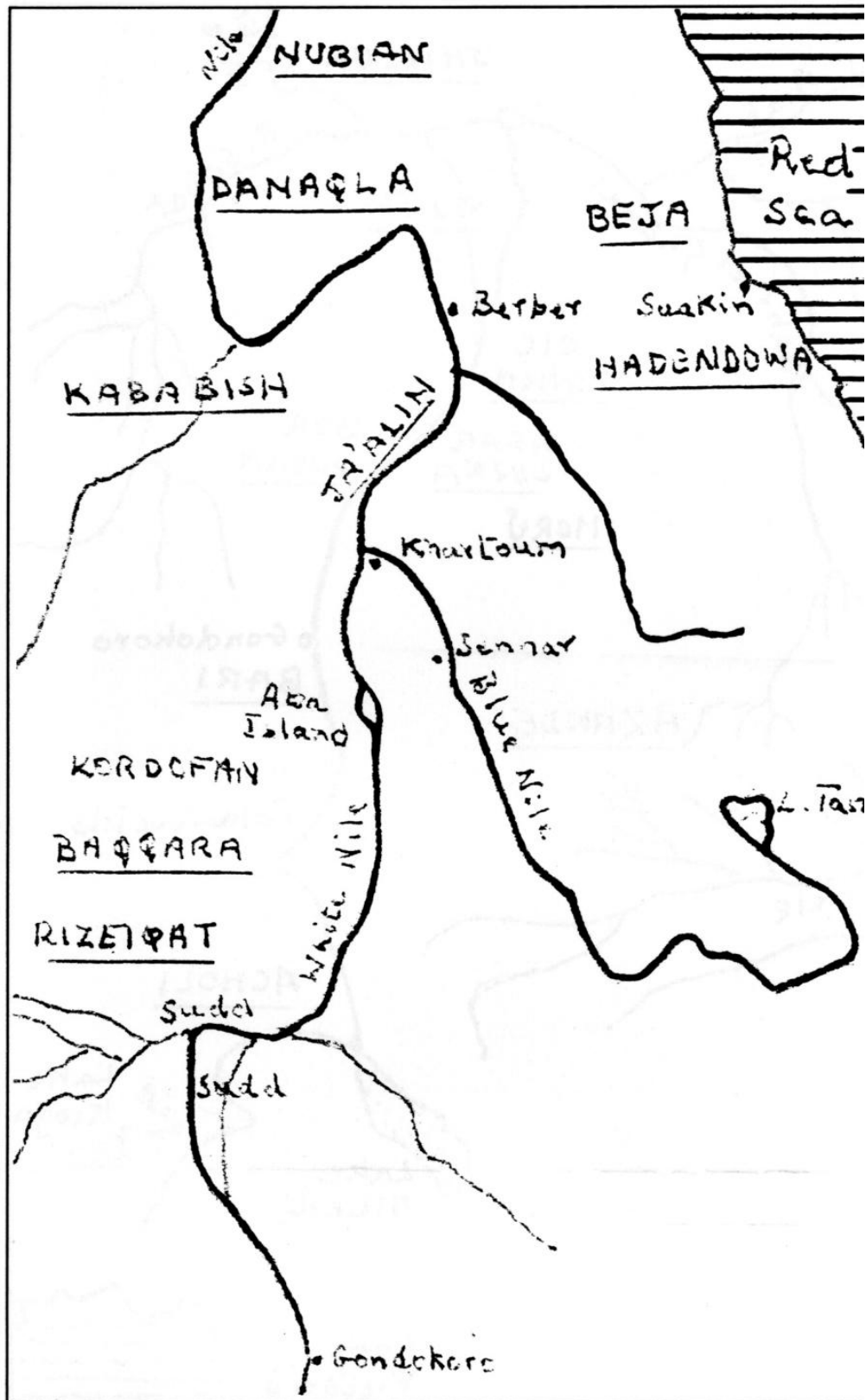

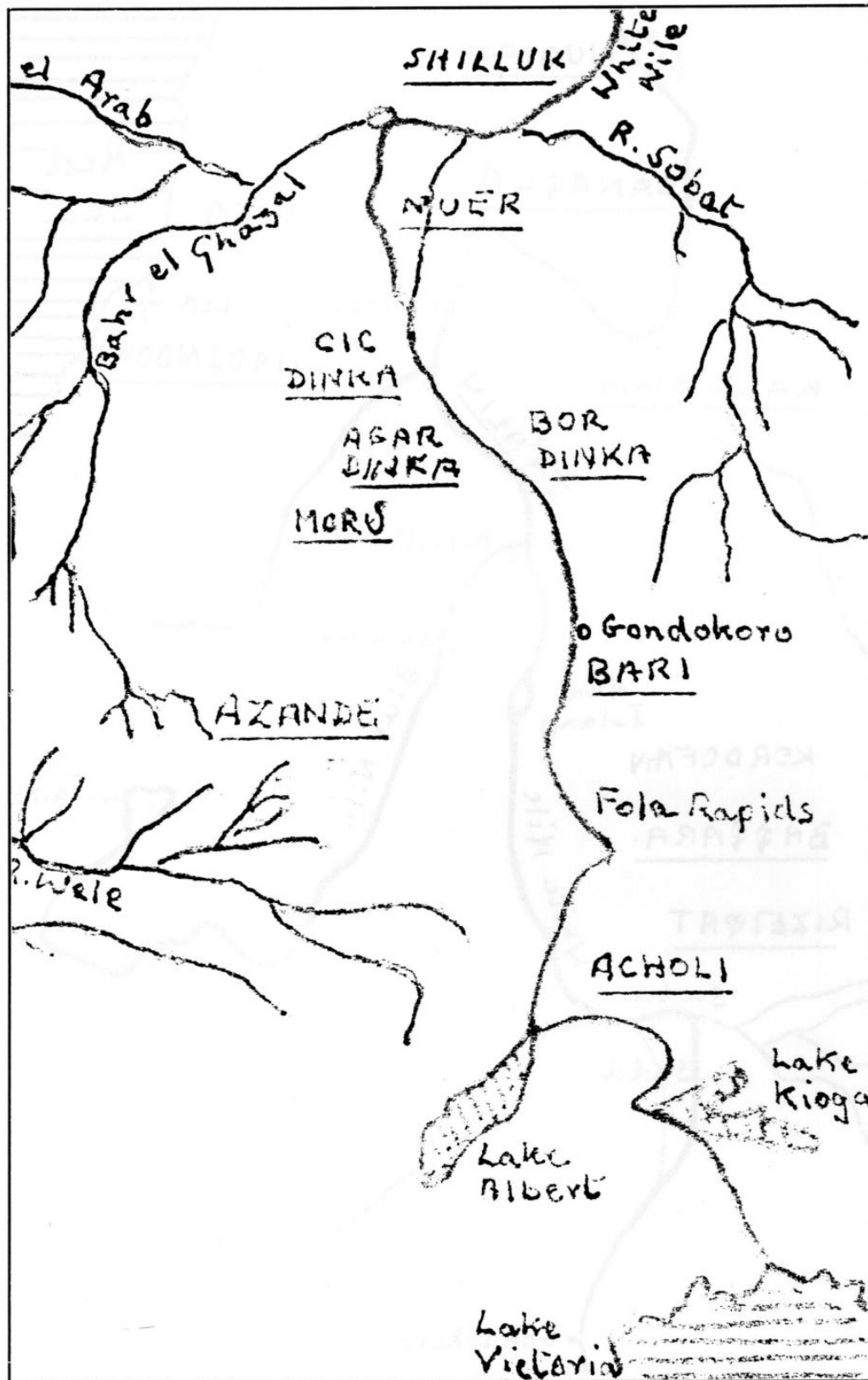


NILE-CONGO WATERSHED



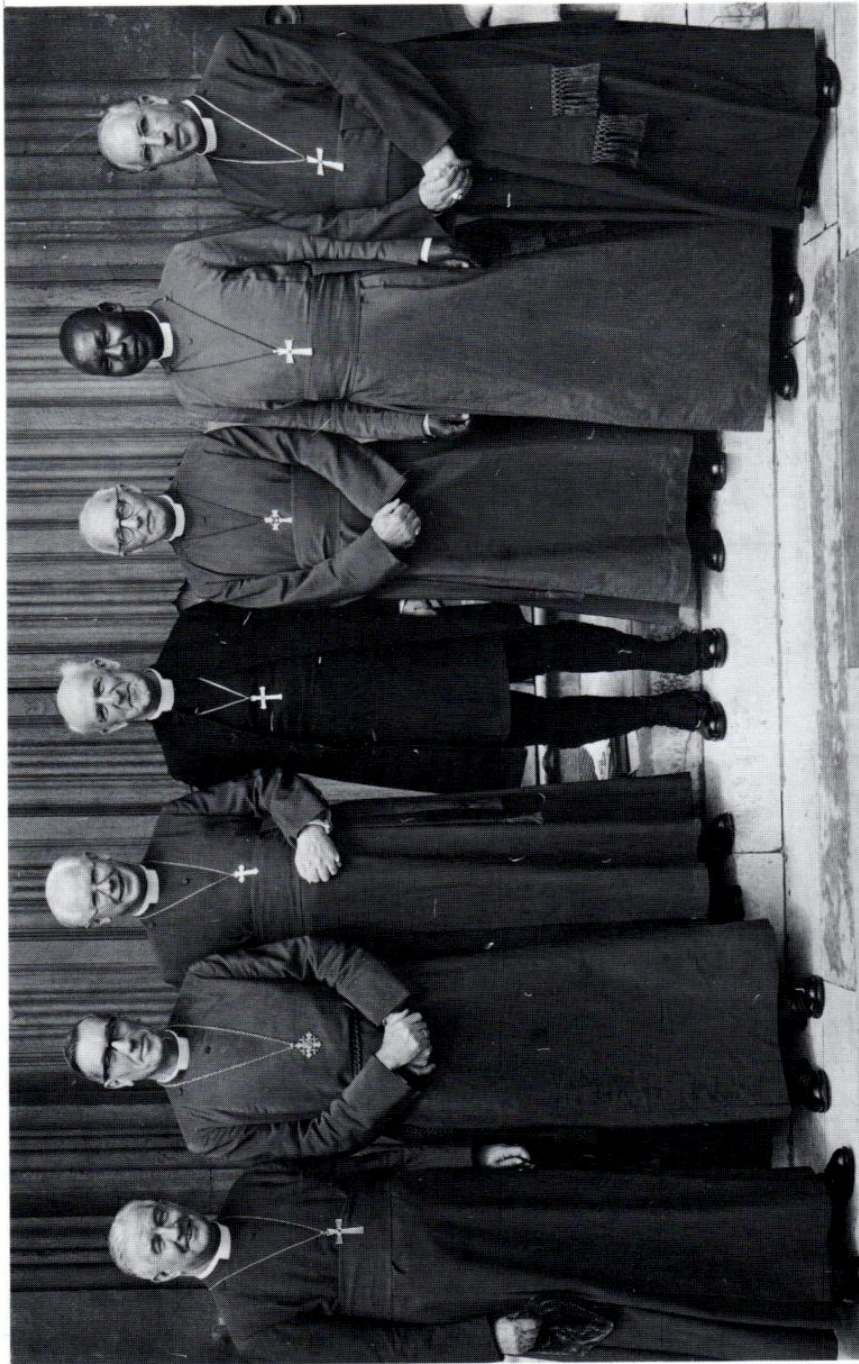

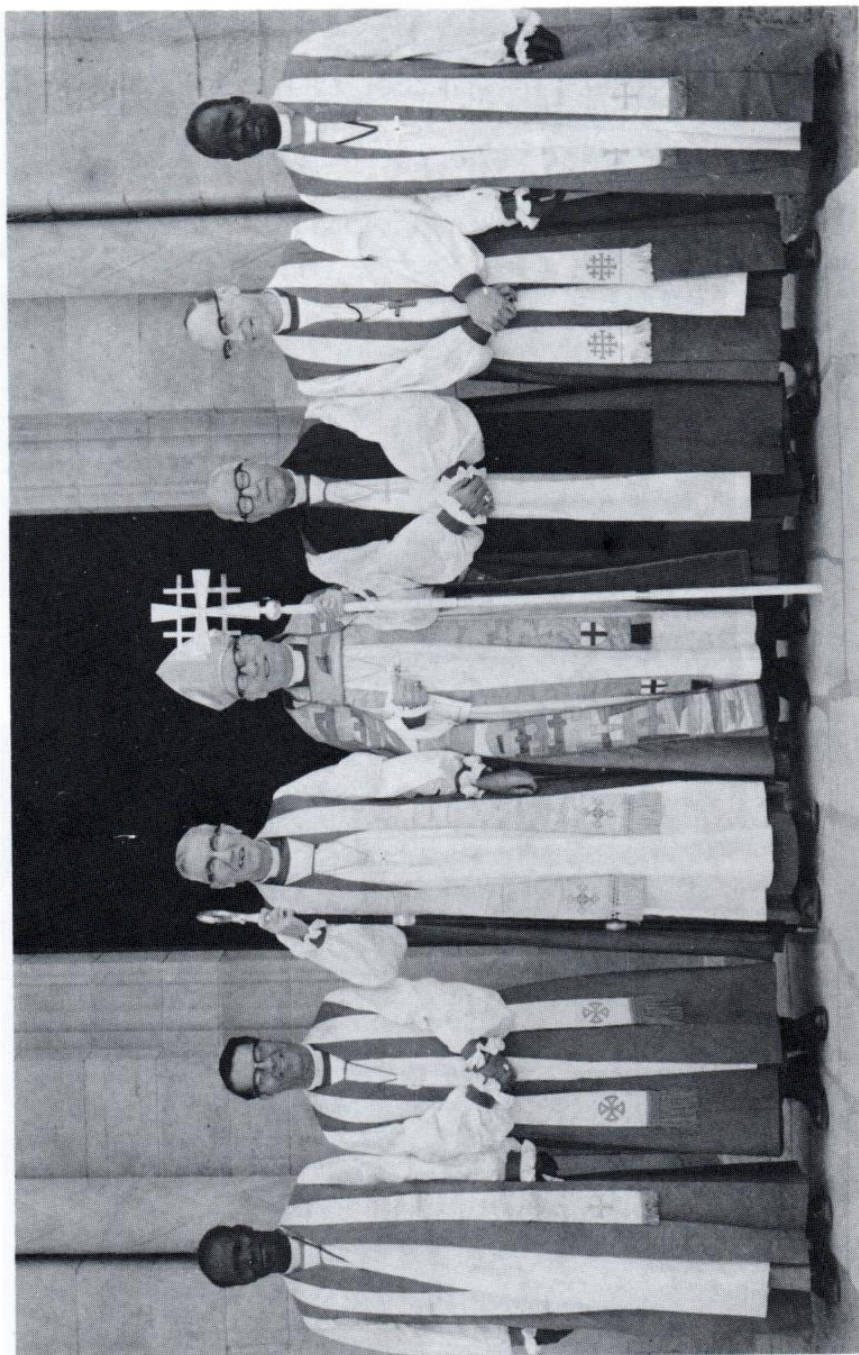

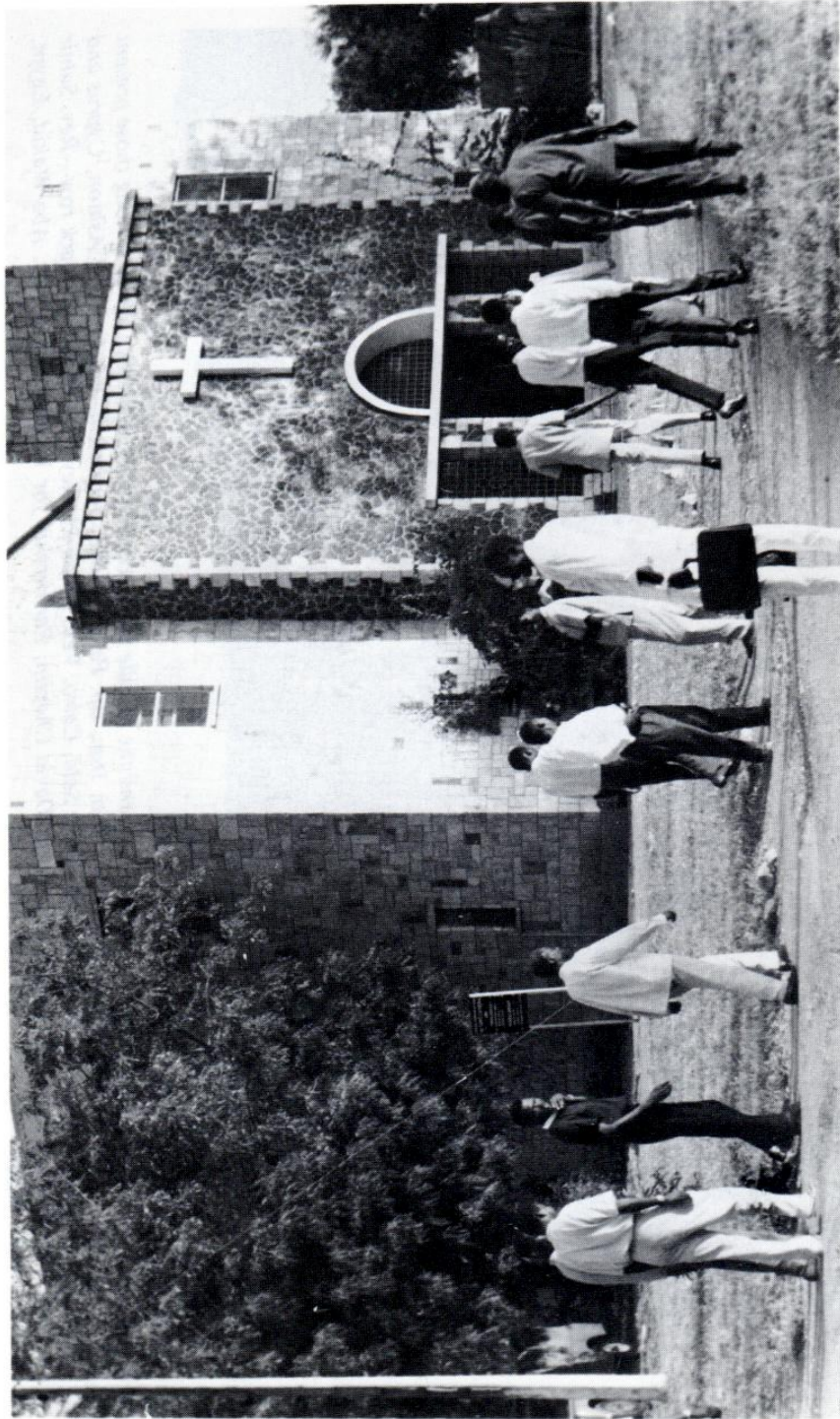
